The Senate praised the dedication of those working to improve the quality of life of people living with paralysis and their families. ## National Partnership to Improve Dementia Care Exceeds Goal to Reduce Use of Antipsychotic Medications in Nursing Homes: CMS Announces New Goal

Coalition provides tools and support to achieve continued decreases

On September 19, The National Partnership to Improve Dementia Care, a public-private coalition, established a new national goal of reducing the use of antipsychotic medications in long-stay



nursing home residents by 25 percent by the end of 2015, and 30 percent by the end of 2016. The coalition includes CMS, consumers, advocacy organizations, providers, and professional associations.

Between the end of 2011 and the end of 2013, the national prevalence of antipsychotic use in long-stay nursing home residents was reduced by 15.1 percent, decreasing from 23.8 percent to 20.2 percent nationwide. The National Partnership is now working with nursing homes to reduce that rate even further.

While the initial focus is on reducing the use of antipsychotic medications, the Partnership's larger mission is to enhance the use of non-pharmacologic approaches and person-centered dementia care practices. CMS will monitor the reduction of antipsychotics as well as the possible consequences.

Some states have achieved significant reduction in their rate of antipsychotic usage. For example, Georgia reduced its rate by 26.4 percent and North Carolina saw a 27.1 percent reduction.

The Partnership has engaged the nursing home industry across the country around reducing use of antipsychotic medications with momentum and success in this area that is expected to continue. In 2011, Medicare Part D spending on antipsychotic drugs totaled \$7.6 billion, which was the second highest class of drugs, accounting for 8.4 percent of Part D spending.

In addition to posting a measure of each nursing home's use of antipsychotic medications on the CMS Nursing Home Compare website, in the coming months CMS plans to add the antipsychotic measure to the calculations that CMS makes for each nursing home's rating on the agency's Five Star Quality Rating System.

Piedmont Geriatric Institute (PGI) is sponsoring a Mental Health First Aid course. Mental Health First Aid is a public education program that introduces participants to risk factors and warning signs of mental illnesses, builds understanding of their impact, and overviews common supports. This 8-hour course uses role-playing and simulations to demonstrate how to offer initial help in a mental health crisis and connect persons to the appropriate professional, peer, social, and self-help care. The program also teaches the common risk factors and warning signs of specific types of illnesses, like anxiety, depression, substance use, bipolar disorder, eating disorders, and schizophrenia.

Mental Health First Aid teaches participants a five-step action plan, ALGEE, to support someone developing signs and symptoms of a mental illness or in an emotional crisis:



- Assess for risk of suicide or harm
- Listen nonjudgmentally
- Give reassurance and information
- Encourage appropriate professional help
- Encourage self-help and other support strategies

Like CPR, Mental Health First Aid prepares participants to interact with a person in crisis and connect the person with help. The program offers concrete tools and answers key questions, like “what do I do?” and “where can someone find help?” Certified Mental Health First Aid instructors will provide a list of community healthcare providers and national resources, support groups, and online tools for mental health and addictions treatment and support. All trainees will receive a program manual to compliment the course materials.

Mental Health First Aid is included on the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration’s National Registry of Evidence-based Programs and Practices (NREPP).

The Contract Year 2014 Financial Report and Service Report (13<sup>th</sup> Month Report) should be completed and electronically submitted to the Department for Aging and Rehabilitative Services (DARS) by the close of business, **November 17, 2014**. This report is used by Area Agencies on Aging (AAAs) to report finalized annual performance, expenditures and receipts for the fiscal period October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2014. The following schedules must be submitted.

- **Final Contract Year 2014 Financial and Service Report:** This year the Aging Monthly Report (AMR) will be used to report compiled annual programmatic and financial information for the period October 1, 2013 to September 30, 2014. When completing your report, select **Final (13<sup>th</sup> Mo)** from the month drop down menu on the payment worksheet. Please name your file, "Final PSA xx," when emailing your submission to [closeoutreports@dars.virginia.gov](mailto:closeoutreports@dars.virginia.gov). Insert your PSA number in the characters denoted by xx.

Please make certain your Agency's AIM or PeerPlace data supports the AMR service data.

- **Final (13<sup>th</sup> Mo) – Schedules A, B, & C:** Schedules A, B, & C have been written in Excel and are available on the DARS website at <http://vda.virginia.gov/reportsandinstructions.asp>. The three schedules are tabbed as separate worksheets in the workbook. The workbook should be downloaded to your computer before completion. Please name the file, "ABC PSA xx," when emailing your submission to: [closeoutreports@dars.virginia.gov](mailto:closeoutreports@dars.virginia.gov). Schedules A, B, & C are to be included in your audited financial statements as supplementary information and your audit firm is **required** to include these schedules in their audit opinion. Please ensure all funds received from DARS are included and that recorded amounts reconcile to the September 2014 remittance advice to be provided by DARS. **Please ensure that the agency submission and the schedules included by your auditor in the audit report are in the current format.**
  - **Schedule A, Status of Funds:** This schedule provides an accounting of grant funds on hand at the beginning of the period, and receipt and expenditures of grant funds during the period. Although general fund awards for the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2014 needed to be obligated by June 30, 2014, the recipient had until September 30, 2014 to liquidate the obligations. If a cash balance exists on September 30, 2014 from any general fund award for the Program Year (PY) ending on June 30, 2014, please refund the balance to DARS with a copy of Schedule A as your remittance advice.
  - **Schedule B, Costs by Program Activity:** This schedule accounts for the expenditure of funds by activity rather than grant. Please ensure that Schedules A & B tie where appropriate. Again, Schedule B has been modified to correspond to the Aging Monthly Report. It now includes separate sections to report Title III activity (Except III-E) and a section to report III-E activity. If there are no audit adjustments, the data reported on your final AMR should be the same as reported on Schedule B.
  - **Schedule C, Status of Inventories:** Tangible personal property purchased with funds from a Federal or State grant should be included. Generally, equipment or large quantities of food would be the main items reported. Equipment with a fair market value of less than \$5,000 per unit should not be reported.

**Contractor Certification Form:** This form should be prepared on AAA letterhead and signed by the AAA Executive Director. The form is available on the [DARS/VDA website](#).
