I am pleased to inform you that the Virginia Commonwealth's State Plan on Aging, under the Older Americans Act, for the period of October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2023, has been approved.

The State Plan outlines a number of significant activities that will serve as a guide for Virginia's aging service network during the next four years. Of particular note is your commitment to the improvement and enhancement of the aging programs and services provided. This is evident in Virginia's effort to address unaddressed needs, and to serve those most in need. The Virginia Department for Aging and Rehabilitative Service (DARS) steps to monitor changes in the aging population groups will focus on major changes that will impact Virginia's aging programs over the next decade and beyond.
